The newest AVATAR Movie The Way of the Water, presents an interesting concept. Whilst it takes a certain amount of stamina to survive such a lengthy movie and I am not advocating for or against the time investment—the indigenous people of this movie present a poignant line which strikes a cord: I see you. # Introducing the 9th Bishop of Maitland-Newcastle Bishop Michael Kennedy

On the 2nd February Pope Francis shared the news in Rome that Bishop Michael Kennedy had accepted the offer to be appointed as the 9th Bishop of our Diocese.

Bishop Michael is an experienced Bishop as he is currently the Bishop of the Armidale Diocese, an appointment he ahs held since 2012. This is not always the case Bishop Michael's predecessors Bishop Bill Wright and Bishop Michael Malone were not Bishops prior to their appointments to lead the Diocese.

All Bishops select a motto on their ordination—in 2012 Bishop Michael selected 'eutes docete' these are the first two words in the lain text of Matthew 28:20 in which Jesus sends his apostles to all the



nations to teach them all that He commanded and to baptise them in the name of the Father, Son and Holy Spirit. Bishop Michael selected this motto as he felt it sums up the role of a Bishop: to spread the Gospel of Jesus Christ and to bring people into communion with Him.

Bishop Michael's installation as the 9th Bishop of Newcastle will take place this Friday 17th March at the Sacred Heart Cathedral Hamilton. This is an invitation only event however, everyone across the Diocese I invited through the live streaming site at 6pm—www.mn.catholic.org.au

Bishop Michel will visit all areas of the Diocese throughout the year so we look forward to him visiting the Maitland Region Parishes.


