
Bishop Michael Kennedy



Mini Vinnies / Stage 3 Bake Stall


ATTENTION EVERYBODY!

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
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You are invited to be a pilgrim on the

aMeN caMiNo!

The purpose of pilgrimage is the journey. You are invited to join the aMeN caMiNo journey and let your stories and experiences meet others. Camino, meaning 'road' or 'way', has a long and established Christian history. A famous pilgrimage is The Camino de Santiago or the Way of St James. The first Christian movement in the 1st century was known as 'The Way'.

The aMeN CaMiNo is a response to a desire to be in communion with each other and our sacred earth. It is an opportunity to pause from routine, immerse yourself in reflection and contemplation, and to provide a moment of space for each person to be conscious of God's gift of grace.

The aMeN caMiNo is an expression of Kinaesthetic Spirituality which focuses on the rhythm of the body, mind and spirit. Pligrims move to a space where they experience self-emptying, allowing room for self-discovery and transformation. Through this encounter, our spirit is awakened to the wonder and awe of our environment. There is time to listen, contemplate, and be silent. Thomas Merton wrote if we are to live spiritually, we "must be alive, body, soul, mind, heart and spirit." The gift of beauty is a grace given in abundance through nature, recognising it as a gift, is to meet God in prayer.

Amen is the word Christians use to say 'yes, we are on our way to God.' By joining us on the aMeN CaMiNo, you are saying yes to something in your heart which is calling you.



An invitation is extended to those who are physically capable of walking long distances over five consecutive days through some challenging tenain and unpredictable weather

Day 1

Pilgrims meet at St John's Chapel Maitland, which was built in 1866, to begin this unique Camino experience. From Maitland, the pilgrimage travels to Baiame Cave in Broke, then on to Mount View to Paxton – 9km

Day 2 and 3

Take a beautiful walk through subtropical rainforest and open sclerophyll forest, navigating some steep ups and downs, often with breathtaking views as you traverse state and national parks. Here you will notice God's creation in all its splendor but also witness the impact of man upon our earth. The end of the third day will welcome pilgrims into St Patrick's and St Bridet's chapel: the only place in the Hunter that Mary Mackillop visited, Typically each day is 20km.

Day 4

Walk along the edge of the foreshore of Lake Macquarie.

The water laps at your feet and the view extends right down the centre of the lake to Belmont. Toronto to Belmont – 25km

Day 5

The expanse of the ocean and all its moods will embrace you as beach, sky and sand become your world. Redhead Beach to Sacred Heart Cathedral - 20km

Cost: \$500 (Single rooms \$200 extra)

What's included with your registration:

- Transport from Sacred Heart Cathedral and during pilgrimage
- Support vehicle to carry luggage
- Four nights accommodatic
- Guided hike with experienced, trained leaders

What is not included:

- Food
- Ensuites in some accommodation
- Day pack personal first aid

Prior to the Camino, pilgrims are expected to attend a Walk and Talk session in preparation for the pilgrimage
