Love, peace and light to you all,



In the midst of the daily grind, carrying the hope of that place in our hearts can be enough, it seems to me, to bring us a sense of peace and consolation.








Reconciliation Week 2023 You are invited!



Arriving at School Students are not to arrive BEFORE 8.30am

Teachers are not on duty before this time and supervision is <u>not provided.</u>

Access to the school before 8.30am is strictly for STAFF ONLY.

Apologies for any inconvenience, but this is an important Child Protection matter.

In addition to Cheryl's usual message above: There are a large number of cars waiting outside for the gate to open. Please note there is before school care available locally across the road in Northern Avenue. In fact many children are starting to wait outside our gate from 8:20 this is not OK.

There are a significant number of our smaller children being dropped off very early (8:30-8:40) and they are struggling to come in the gate or manage the early morning at school. Coming early adds a significant amount of time to an already long day for our little people.

The majority of students arrive between 8:50 and 9am. This means there are more children here and so your child's friends are more likely to be at school—making starting the day a much happier experience.

Please consider dropping your child off a little closer to the start of the school day if possible. Teachers are always happy to assist our students however, the before school period is a busy preparation time for lessons also.

<u>Gymnastics</u>



We are loving our Gymnastics lessons for sport! A little note—as it is getting colder the mats and ground are very cold.

Students need to take their shoes off to be on the mat and normal socks are too slippery. If your child is feeling their feet are too cold in gymnastics lessons they can wear non-

slip socks or reef shoes if they have them.





Sport Uniform

This week we begin the MAT program across all classes. Martial Arts Training as a vehicle for social emotional skill building.

Infants will wear Sport Uniform Thursdays only as they have been.

Primary Classes need to wear their Sport Uniform THURSDAY AND FRIDAY please.



Some tips for being safe around school:

Always slow down to 40km/h and be aware of crossings. Always park legally around school. (There is a disabled park in Northern Ave)

It is safest for children to get in and out of the car from the footpath-side door.

Manoeuvres such as U-turns and 3 point turns are dangerous at busy times.


Model safe and conscious behaviour to your children– they will learn from you.

NEVER double park this puts children at risk.


Never park in no stopping or Bus Zones.

Code of Conduct for School Students on Buses

Behaviour on buses

- Use appropriate language not offensive or racist language
- Fighting, spitting, feet on seats, throwing things in or from the bus is not permitted
- No eating or drinking (other than water) unless for medical reasons or the bus operator gives written permission.
- Offer seats to adults including people with a disability, elderly or expectant mothers
- Do not push or shove other people
- Do not bully or harass other passengers or the driver
- Avoid attracting the attention of the driver except in the case of emergency **Do not play music at such volume that it may distract the bus driver or other passengers.**

Safety on and near buses

- Obey reasonable directions from the driver (for example, where to sit or to remain in the bus)
- Remain in your seat do not move around the bus unnecessarily
- If standing, remain behind the front passenger seat and always keep a secure hand hold
- Keep bags and other items clear of the aisle
- Do not allow any part of your body to protrude out of the bus at any time
- Wait for the bus in a quiet and orderly manner including at bus interchanges
- Stand away from the roadside until the bus comes to a complete stop
- Allow other passengers to leave the bus before stepping onto the bus in a single line
- Wait until the bus stops before moving to get off the bus at your designated stop

Cross the road where and when it's safe to do so, use crossings/traffic lights where available.

Legal considerations on buses

- Wear the seat belt properly adjusted and fastened, if one is available
- Obey the law that bans smoking on buses
- Ensure that buses are not vandalised report any damage, graffiti and window etching, to the driver
- Do not interfere with bus property, equipment and signage
- Do not leave rubbish on the bus, or at bus stops or interchanges.
